

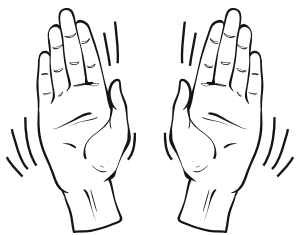


“I want to contribute to the discussion”

Raise a hand or forefinger when you wish to contribute to the discussion with a general point

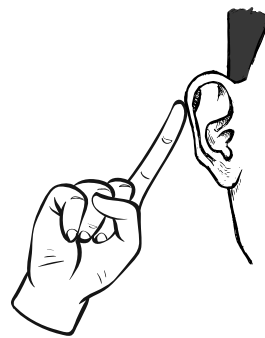


“I want to offer something”

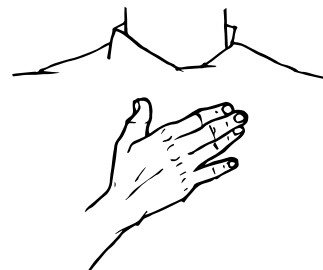


“I agree” or “Sounds good”

When you hear an opinion that you agree with, wave your hands with your fingers pointing upwards by the side of your body, around shoulders/face height. this lets everyone see how many people agree and saves a lot of time as people don't have to say “I'd just like to add that I agree with...” the gesture comes from British Sign Language where it means applause.



“I can't hear”



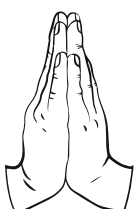
“I care” or “I feel you” or “I respect you”



“I need help”

It could be that you don't understand, or need clarification. This helps avoid cutting a person when they are talking and let's them know that you need help/clarification.

This work integrates cultural practices and hosting approaches from across human civilizations, and is inspired by the last decades of large-scale public activities and social movements. The purpose of this non-verbal communication is to foster deeper empathy and connection between participants of co-creation activities.
